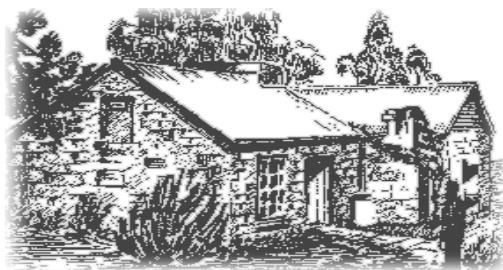

JUST A LITTLE REFRESHER ABOUT SOME OF OUR LOCAL PLACE NAMES.

Cooranbean

Place Names of the Central Coast by Eileen Pratt reminds us that it means "creek that winds". It has been spelt a few different ways: originally Cooranbean by Peter Fagan but later Cooranbene, Coorumbene, and now the creek is spelt Coorumbine where it goes under Brisbane Water Drive. So our cottage was named for the little windy creek up which "small ketches and other sailing craft could moor in the creek next to the Red Cow Inn (now Henry Kendall Cottage) but with the coming of the railway, and building of the breakwater across Fagan's Bay, the creek gradually silted up and is virtually non-existent next to the cottage".

Brisbane Water

Until 1825 this stretch of water was known as the "North East Arm of Broken Bay". In that year it was renamed *Brisbane Water* in honour of Sir Thomas Macdougall Brisbane, Governor of NSW from 1821 to 1825.

(Have you ever viewed or wondered about the monument commemorating this event, on the hill overlooking Booker Bay and Orange Grove?)

Orange Grove

The late George Fountain gave the name of Orange Grove to the cottage he built when he settled in the district in 1913, one of two cottages he built on the waterfront near the Rip. Citrus trees were planted at the cottage and the locality became accepted as Orange Grove.

Fagans Bay

Peter Fagan, from Clare, County Neath, Ireland, was an Irish convict transported for seven years. He arrived at Sydney in the "Lord Sidmouth" on 19th February, 1821. After he obtained his Ticket of Leave, he was given a Grant of land at Point Clare and started farming and cattle breeding. He purchased another site at West Gosford and built the sandstone cottage which is now called Henry Kendall Cottage.

Woy Woy

A corruption of the aboriginal name for the area, "Wy Wy", meaning "much water" or "big lagoon".
